Her research focuses on the ways in which disaster resilience, social justice, and engineering education intersect, particularly in terms of the impacts of displacement and forced relocation on engineering, what it means to be a disaster-resilient education system, and the importance of convergent, interdisciplinary approaches for engineers addressing disaster resilience in their work.
